Our dedicated and determined efforts at sustaining the good work of the last few years, particularly the FDI Congress and the 'Sushruta' Awards, have made IDA more visible, besides enhancing the image of its members and their professional advancement. There are many challenges faced by the dental profession today. Some may be addressed by establishing strategic partnerships while others need a new dispensation.

Against this backdrop, I am happy to present to you the Annual Report for the year 2014-15. I must, at the outset, confess that, but for the cooperation and support from members and constituent branches, IDA would not have been able to achieve even a semblance of what it has been able to.

A distinguishing feature of IDA's activities this year was the launch of the first ever "Sushruta" National Oral Healthcare Awards in Mumbai. Encouraged by its success, IDA has made it an annual feature of its activities. To promote the Indian dental industry overseas and enlist exhibitors' participation in 'Make in India' campaign, an Indian pavilion was set up at FDI Bangkok which was greatly appreciated by all. Members would be happy to know that the industry welcomed the idea and ten manufacturers participated. The launch of Clinical Research Programme and accredited continuing education programme ushered in a new age that facilitated members to keep pace with the latest in dental science. The post-graduate programme in Clinical Research has been receiving good response which prompted us to commence a second batch. I am happy that good many people have been availing of it. Likewise, the underprivileged school children are being cared for in a "Smile Around the World" Programme in partnership with FDI and Ivoclar.

Training programmes for Tobacco Intervention Initiative which could not be held for a major part of last year on account of FDI Congress resumed this year. I must say that the encouraging response resulted in a substantial number availing of the orientation training. It again marks our intent at tobacco cessation. The TII Centres and Spot Centres are significant contributions to oral healthcare management aimed at reducing incidences of oral cancer and tobacco related diseases.

It's a matter of great personal satisfaction that, during the year, your Association has recorded substantial growth in membership. However, it's necessary to sustain the momentum. At the same time, I must admit that, considering the large number of dentists in the country, there's considerable scope for increasing membership. Vigorous efforts are needed to augment membership.

A matter causing concern is the continuing lack of subscriptions to our publications. Patronage by members is the need of the hour and increased subscriptions would help the publications break-even, increase revenue and make IDA financially stronger. Despite renewed appeals, subscriptions to publications leave much to be desired. I take this opportunity to acknowledge the excellent cooperation and support received from the CC members whose direction and guidance contributed significantly to our performance. The hard work put in by everyone at IDA HO deserves appreciation. But for their commendable contribution, cooperation and support, we would not have been able to accomplish these results.

I feel a sense of fulfilment at what we, together, have been able to accomplish. But there's a long way to go and I need your cooperation and support in taking IDA to higher levels of excellence in meeting the challenges of the future.

# IDA Activities: Review of Performance

## IDA and commitment to dental excellence

Change is the essence of growth. But these are days of "Acche Din" and, consistent with this prospect of change, we need to move "forward" as well, lest we may be left far behind. Members are aware that our primary goal is the attainment of optimal oral health for all, in addition to promoting professional advancement of members. Consistent with this aim, IDA has been focusing all its efforts at changing things and moving "forward" for the "better days" to come while endorsing continuity to sustain the momentum of activities that have established IDA as an enviable institution committed to dental excellence.

The changing technologies and the growing demands of globalisation of a dynamic and competitive environment bring in their wake newer challenges which are being addressed suitably to enable members enlarge their professional careers and enhance their skills to provide quality service to the community. The strategy of pioneering prevention has, to a great extent, contributed to a change in the oral health scenario in the country for the better. And the "Swachh Bharat Abhiyan" is expected to improve personal and environmental hygiene and this, in turn, will help IDA, committed as it is to ushering in an improved dental health environment in the country.

## IDA Office Infrastructure

In keeping with the expanding role of IDA and to remain in the forefront of innovation to meet the emerging global challenges and competition, changes in the present office infrastructure was found necessary to project a new global image. Organizational restructuring supported with state of the art office equipment enabled IDA to meet the growing challenges of globalisation so that we remained in the

forefront of global oral healthcare activities. Larger office space and provision of modern equipment and gadgets that aided efficient functioning gave the aura of a global set up.

The growing international collaborative efforts also required that IDA cannot remain confined to its national precincts. Appropriate mechanisms for mobilising resources and harnessing of opportunities in varied spheres were put in place. Employment of adequate staff and setting up of systems that permit better functional integration and operational coordination were ensured. This was felt necessary, particularly in the light of the need for building brand identity and image for greater visibility of IDA. Needless to say, these have contributed to effective and efficient execution of programmes and projects.

A separate division with the exclusive mandate to communication and brand marketing was set up. It was aimed at effective marketing of IDA's programmes and activities, particularly to increase online presence of the brand and for digital marketing. In addition, the division would also indulge in social media campaigns for IDA programmes and activities, including increasing the ranking of IDA on web page search engines.

While renewed efforts at corporatization of IDA are being continued, streamlining of the functioning of numerous projects and programmes is attempted for better operational coordination and marketing aimed at ensuring revenue generation. With these changes, IDA has assumed an iconic image and a new thrust for promoting enhanced oral healthcare awareness among the people besides professional advancement of its members. These changes have helped transform IDA into an enviable institution of professional repute.





# IDA and Development of General Database

“Things get done only if the data we gather can inform and inspire those in a position to make a difference.”

Building meticulously an incredible assortment of information database and its effective management and skilful execution is important. A noteworthy activity that IDA can be proud of is continuous refinement and sophistication of the general database. Members are aware that such an advanced software system facilitates better accession of data and smooth office administration. Beginning with streamlining of its membership data, this general database bestows a storehouse of information relating to various segments: IDA's programmes and projects, dental manufacturers and their products, suppliers, video libraries, placements, forthcoming events, list of dental colleges and universities, dental laboratories and what not. The e-trade-fair-cum-directory services enable traders and manufacturers of dental products and laboratories to place their products and services on the directory to secure a wider outreach of potential clients. And it is a facility increasingly being availed of by all concerned.

## IDA and Data Management

The extraordinary expansion in IDA's functions and programmes, underlines the importance and need for an effective and efficient database management system to facilitate prompt functional integration and coordination of activities. Members are aware that your Association has developed in-house advanced software systems that facilitated better execution of projects and programmes besides better office administration. It may not be out of place to mention here that your Association has also developed websites for branches and for a few state dental councils. This has enabled branches to ensure effective operational and functional coordination, access data of IDA office bearers, both State and Local Branches, national and international dental associations, organize conferences and workshops, conduct online continuing dental education programmes, interact with dental colleges, universities,



dental product manufacturers, and the like. The system developed is capable of online management of all programmes and projects, membership registration as also effective and efficient maintenance of data. This has not only enabled timely and improved communication with its members and its numerous branches, but also facilitates logical planning and implementation of various programmes and projects, not to speak of economy in cost, time and ease in execution. A range of other software packages intended at instituting systems and procedures for improving efficiency and performance standards and improving communications have also been developed. While this has, no doubt, enabled IDA in ensuring better communication with its members and the various branches, it has also helped in the systematic planning and execution of various programmes and projects.

The data management system developed by IDA, in addition, permits access to a vast body of dental personnel in the country and data pertaining to their gender, qualifications, specialities, and deployment. In short, the data management system developed has enabled IDA to better organize its membership registrations and renewals, continuing dental education programmes and a host of such other activities with apparent ease hitherto unknown.

## IDA'S India Pavilion at FDI Congress in Bangkok

You may be happy to know that a special Indian pavilion was erected at the venue of the FDI Annual World Dental Congress held in Bangkok in September last where ten Indian dental product manufacturers displayed their products with a view to promoting Indian dental industry overseas and inviting participation in “Make in India” initiative. Besides, the venture also facilitated IDA office bearers to interact with global participants for dissemination of information on IDA activities and to respond to enquiries, including matters relating to their participation in the World Dental Show. It was quite gratifying that such a stall served a very useful purpose. IDA also took the opportunity to showcase the 69<sup>th</sup> annual conference being organized in New Delhi as an event of great national significance.





# IDA and Membership Development

## The goal

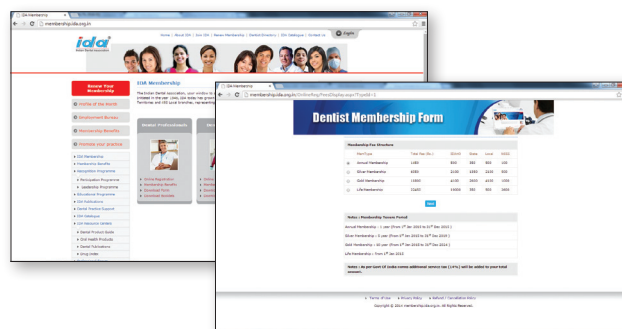
## Online Membership Era

With the facility of communication now being conducted in electronic language, the members are now in a position to access information online and update details and renew membership. The new membership software facilitates trouble free registration, renewal and tracking of the progress of applications for membership or renewals. This is expected to set the stage for a remarkable surge in membership strength. Attractive privileges are on offer for the aspiring members which the member can avail of with the aid of IDA Membership card.

Concerted efforts are being made to augment membership through various means such as communications, personal contacts, renewed appeals, and life membership. Efforts at enrolling associate membership of overseas Indian dental professionals are bearing fruits. Special efforts are also on to augment the student membership base. Developing a list of practical techniques and strategies for increasing membership that have been proven to be successful, and which are appropriate to the cultural and economic needs of members, is the need of the hour.

## Membership Drive

The membership development drive, in essence, is motivated by the eagerness to put the Indian dental community on an equal footing with similar global institutions. With the ever increasing number of dental practitioners in the country, the prospect for broadening the present membership base brooks no delay. It also helps the member to get involved in important initiatives of IDA like the Tobacco Intervention Initiative, National Oral Health Programme, Oral Health Month, CDE and the like. An IDA member can become a member of the American Dental Association by paying just only US \$12 instead of \$ 75; a facility increasingly availed of by members.





## Student Membership

It is not an exaggeration to say that IDA provides numerous opportunities exclusively meant for students for expanding their knowledge and exhibiting their talent and scholarship. The privilege of IDA membership is open to all dental students. It might interest members to know that student membership has shown a consistent increase in the last couple of years. As on December 2015 the student members numbered 9510. IDA membership offers the student community a platform to discuss topical issues or important matters in dentistry including dental education ranging from reforms in undergraduate education and career options to the influence of international policy on health, new treatment techniques, etc.

## IDA Students' Wing

Members would be happy to know that with a view to augmenting student membership, and increase student participation in IDA activities, efforts are on to form student wings in dental colleges. The dean/principal of the college or Senior Faculty Member / College Student Secretary with student members shall form the IDA Students' Wing. The IDA Students' Wing will be demographically located within the college or university campus. The IDA Students' Wing shall function independently under the auspices of HO and remain affiliated to IDA Local branch and IDA state branch of the respective demographic regions. The Students' Wing shall abide by all rules and regulations of the Association.







## IDA and Membership Promotion Booklets

Members would be happy to know that with a view to enlarging membership base, specially compiled information booklets have been made highlighting a host of information on IDA, its organizational set up, activities and the procedures to be followed to become its member for the benefit of the potential members.



## Need for Action

Needless to say that, considering the large number of dentist population in the country, the present membership strength (21300 annual, 9510 life, 91 gold, 501 silver) leaves much to be desired. Vigorous efforts need to be made by all concerned to improve the number of primary membership. At the same time, the challenges posed by the calls of regular renewals, updating of personal information of members, etc., need to be suitably addressed. The need to strengthen the membership drive with a view to augmenting and widening the membership base is the need of the hour.

## IDA and International Affiliations

IDA's affiliation with renowned global associations such as the Federation of Dentaire International (FDI), the Commonwealth Dental Association (CDA) and the International Association for Dental Research (IADR), etc., has immensely benefited members. This strong and formidable alliance has opened the way for quite a few of our members occupying executive positions in the past. IDA congratulates them and would like to express its gratitude to the members for their whole-hearted cooperation and support to move ahead in these spheres.

## Branch Formation

Expansion of branches is symptomatic of the growth of an institution. Consistent with the expanding role of IDA, a good number of branches have been established during the year under review. Bifurcation of Andhra Pradesh into Andhra Pradesh and Telangana led to the opening of the Telangana State Branch and transfer of the geographically located local branches to Telangana. Members would be happy to know that during the year approvals to open 17 new branches have been given. They are: Anantapur, Guntur, Vizianagaram (Andhra Pradesh); Laheriasarai, Siwan (Bihar); Udipi (Karnataka); Vadakara (Kerala); Betul, Sheoni (Madhya Pradesh); Hingoli, Khamsaon, Mlkapur, Pune East (Maharashtra); Bhadrak, Kanika, Millenium, Nilanchal Puri (Odisha); Nagaur (Rajasthan); Virudhunagar (Tamil Nadu); Bhagyanagar, Cyberabad, Nalgonda, Tandur (Telengana) Faizabad (Uttar Pradesh); and Bankura, North 24 PGS (West Bengal).

## 125<sup>th</sup> Birth Anniversary celebrations of Dr. R Ahmed

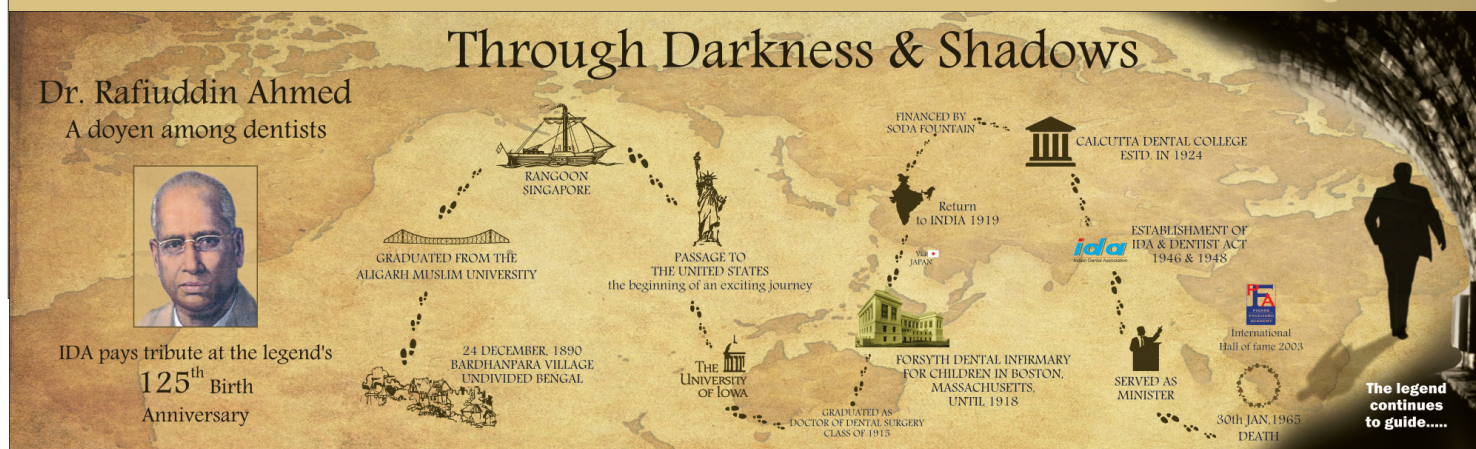

## IDA and National Health Policy 2015-Draft

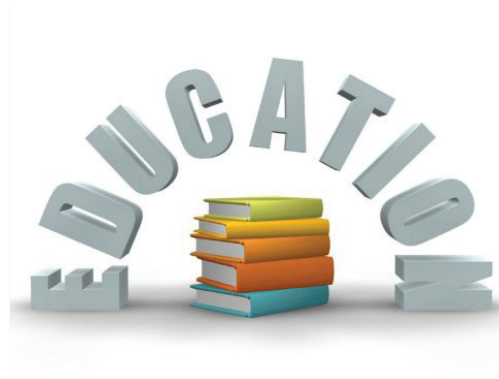


The Government of India in the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, in December 2014, had framed the National Health Policy 2015-Draft and had placed it in public domain for comments, suggestions and feedback. Your Association, as a part of its advocacy, had prepared its initial suggestions in the form of a draft note which it circulated among presidents and secretaries of branches soliciting views. On the basis of feedback received we have finalised our suggestions and submitted to the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare at its portal. The suggestions made are given below in brief:

- IDA should be associated with oral healthcare planning and implementation
- A national oral health survey must be organised
- Unregulated expansion of dental colleges must be checked and directed to rural areas.
- Government must incorporate oral health planning as part of national health policy and create adequate infrastructure at public hospital levels
- Government must declare oral cancer a notifiable disease
- Oral care must be made part of syllabus at schools
- Compulsory dental check-up for school children must form part of oral health policy planning
- Oral cancer and other oral diseases research centres must be set up in established dental colleges ensuring adequacy of funds. A separate allocation of funds for oral health is the need of the hour.
- Insurance cover must be extended to dental diseases as well and the requirement of hospitalization stressed by insurance companies waived.

The final draft submitted to the government had been circulated among members for their information.

## IDA and National Education Policy



You may be happy to know that at the request of the Ministry of Human Resources Development, your Association had forwarded its suggestions for incorporation of dental health in the syllabus of school children. The suggestions highlighted those aspects that increased oral health awareness among children to improve their overall health and productivity. IDA had implored the government to seriously and sincerely consider implementing the suggestions in the new Education Policy being formulated. Briefly stated, these included:

- Oral health must be made a part of the syllabus of school children
- Importance of oral health in overall health and well being to be highlighted
- Common oral diseases to be described in brief, particularly dental caries or tooth decay, gum disease and oral cancer and their severe consequences on general health, if timely treatment is not provided
- Oral cancer and the contributing factors must be adequately described and the serious public health problems that it conjures up for policy makers, including deleterious effects of tobacco use on health
- The role of oral hygiene and other supplementary aids such as mouthwashes, balanced diet, etc., in preserving oral health to be accorded greater emphasis
- School managements must be instructed to hold mandatory health check up camps including dental checkups as a part of school activity

We are hopeful that the above suggestions would be given the consideration they richly merit and have assured the ministry all assistance that may be required in this regard.



## IDA and Global Exhibition on Services

You will be happy to know that your Association participated in the Global Exhibition on Services (GES), inaugurated by the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi in April last. The exhibition was jointly organised by the Government of India, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, the Confederation of Indian Industry, and the Services Export Promotion Council. GES offered a platform to showcase India's strength in the services sector. Most of the players in the healthcare services sector had participated.




The object in IDA participating at the GES was to share the platform with other likeminded agencies in the field of healthcare with a view to:

- (i) enlarging the scope of outreach in our combined effort at improving the health of the nation, and
- (ii) exploring the possibility of replication of some of the programmes in other countries in our endeavour to improve global oral health.

The Exhibition turned out to be a meeting place for countries numbering over sixty to forge new business relationships in the services sector, particularly in healthcare.

There is no gainsaying the fact that the dental healthcare service providers have a significant role to play in improving the oral health scenario in the country. In this connection, the oral health initiatives such as National Oral Health Programme, Oral Cancer Foundation, National Oral Cancer Registry, Tobacco Intervention Initiative, Child Dental Centre, etc., launched by your Association, you all would agree, contribute significantly to oral healthcare management and thus contribute to better national health index of the people. At the same time, rewarding those who have done outstanding work in the field of oral healthcare and motivating them to strive for greater accolades was another initiative taken by your Association through institution of awards for excellence in oral care. The awards gave healthcare professionals in India a platform to benchmark their achievements against their peers besides giving the award winners a professional boost to perform better and accomplish higher deeds.

## National Oral Health Programme



oral health conditions in the country. It aims at assessing the needs, monitoring outcomes, improving access to oral healthcare and reducing disparities thereby contributing to IDA's avowed goal of attaining optimal oral health for all. It's a programme that combines preventive measures with accent on education to create oral health awareness among the various segments of the population.

Oral diseases, caused through apparent neglect, affect the quality of life and have serious consequences on other

parts of the body and contribute significantly to the disease burden of the country. The programme takes care of the oral health of different entities under the NOHP banner, viz., children, the family, the elderly, and the corporate personnel. The rural people and children with disabilities are considered special categories.

To hasten the process, unique identification cards have been devised and designed which bestow the necessary oral healthcare services required to sustain oral health and hygiene among them. Thus there are cards for children (Child Oral Health Card); adult (Family Oral Health Card), the elderly (Platinum Oral Health Card) the disabled (Special Privileged Oral Health Card), and the corporate staff (National Oral Health Card) offering many oral health benefits under the National Oral Health Programme umbrella. The National Oral Health Card ensures convenient access to oral health to the corporate sector staff in the confines of their own familiar working environment.

Members would agree that a sizeable segment of the rural population is ignorant of the significance of oral health and hygiene and its impact on general health. A majority of the rural adult population, prone to tooth decay or gum disease, is toothless due to the crippling nature of dental diseases. Seized of the plight of the rural masses, IDA has devised under NOHP a rural oral health card called "Muskaan" which is aimed at providing dental care at affordable rates to all segments of the rural population, including the socially marginalised. You all will agree that educating the rural masses about the maintenance of oral hygiene is an important part of the exercise. NOHP assumes importance as it introduces preventive, interceptive, curative and educational oral healthcare into the existing dental care system in rural India.







## Dental check-ups under NOHP

Members will be happy to know that during

the year under reference numerous dental check-up camps and talks to generate oral health awareness were organized to take care of oral health needs of children, the elderly, the disabled, and the employees of the corporate sector. We are grateful to the authorities associated with these institutions for their cooperation and support in enabling IDA to offer oral care services to the community as a part of its social responsibility. The dental check-up camps were as under:

### a) School children

Promoting oral health services among school children is one way of achieving and maintaining good oral health among the next generation of people. It stems from the recognition that good physical and mental health is critical to a student's ability to learn and achieve success. A large number of children and parents have limited knowledge of the causes and prevention of the most common of oral diseases. Hence targeting of children for oral health education is important, since the lifestyle and hygiene practices established at an early age can go a long way in spending rest of the life in a healthy way. Therefore, teaching children maintenance of proper oral care and hygiene at a very young age will pay lifelong dividends.

Training teachers and parents is another. Oral health knowledge of schoolteachers leaves much to be desired. School teachers can effectively influence student's knowledge, attitude and practices regarding oral health and can bring about behavioural changes. Hence, training of teachers as also parents in oral healthcare habits helps improve oral health of the community.

IDA believes that oral health education must equip children of the basic importance of teeth and their care and the links that oral health has with overall health and quality of life. Exposing teachers and parents to oral health and hygiene is expected to improve the oral health scenario of the community.

Activities such as free dental check-ups, distribution of samples of toothpaste and toothbrushes as well as educational leaflets and posters and large-scale community-based oral health camps are a part of the agenda of activities.

During the year under review free dental check-ups were held in as many as 9 schools from covering 3085 students. Following dental check up, the children were given treatment plans for further treatment, wherever necessary. Needless to say, all these children are proud owners of child oral health card. Presentations on oral health and nutrition were made to students to improve their knowledge about dental health.

### b) Disabled Children

It might interest members to know that a dental check-up camp was organized in three schools meant for disabled children covering 393 children.

### c) Corporate staff

Members would be happy to know that during the current



year, under this pioneering activity of NOHP, oral health check up of employees of ten establishments was carried out. In all 965 patients underwent oral health check up. Employees who had oral problems availed of the services provided and were advised of the importance of regular dental visits for oral care. These oral health examinations were preceded by lectures by dental professionals to make the employees become familiar with the importance of maintaining oral health and hygiene.

Members would be happy to know that IDA opened a small dental treatment clinic at THE CLINIC, at Kamla Mills, Lower Parel, for the basic treatments such as scaling and polishing, restoration, cavity fillings, counselling for tobacco cessation etc., to help the nearby corporate houses and their staff during working hours.

Dental surgeons conducted oral health awareness lectures for the corporate staff informing them on how to take care of their teeth and gum and the need to visit the dentist regularly. They were also made aware of the effects of tobacco and oral health problems of women during their early stages of pregnancy as also the correct technique of brushing.

### d) Community Dental Check Up

Members may be happy to know that under the NOHP banner, quite a few community camps numbering six were held during the year in different locations covering 1730 patients.

### e) Rural Dental Check Up

In our thrust to the rural areas, IDA was able to organize four dental check-up camps in the rural areas covering 1278 patients. The activities under NOHP had a low coverage this year owing to the staff being busy with FDI Congress. We hope to pick up momentum in the years ahead.

### f) Women's Dental Check Up

A dental check up camp for women was organized benefiting 85 women. They were advised of the need for maintenance of oral hygiene to take care of their oral health problems during the early stages of pregnancy and the need for nutritious diet. The right way of brushing was imparted to the patients.

### g) Dental Check-up at Remand Home for Juveniles

IDA in association with Terna Dental College carried out a three-day dental treatment camp at Remand Home for Juveniles at Matunga in November last year. with in Mobile dental van on in November last year. The only limitation was that they want a dental mobile van to carry out the treatment. A team of dentists carried out the dental check-up for 250 juveniles who were found suffering from various afflictions, viz., stained /calculus, periodontitis including early stages of cancer among the boys.



## FDI-Ivoclar-IDA Programme



### Smile around the World - Healthy Smile Happy Smile

Members would be happy to know that your Association has partnered with FDI World Dental Federation and Ivoclar Vivadent, a leading international dental equipment producer, in launching a novel oral health initiative "Smile around the World". The objective of the new initiative is to improve the oral health status of school children amongst the disadvantaged sections of the community with limited access to oral healthcare aimed at bringing smiles on their faces. This is being done by creating oral health awareness amongst the rural and underprivileged children, a goal being pursued by IDA over the past few years. The idea is to follow a strategy of prevention and early control of oral diseases through educating children and the community.

The programme was officially launched at the 103rd FDI Annual World Dental Congress in Bangkok in September last year. The rationale of the programme stems from the fact that a large number of underprivileged children do not have access to information about oral health and hygiene and that good oral hygiene learnt at an early age will help ensure good oral health throughout their life.

In all 5000 disadvantaged school children in the age group of 6 to 8 years from 21 schools were covered under the programme. The focus obviously is on improving oral health of children from among the disadvantaged population, including mentally challenged children, through oral health check-ups and enhancing oral health awareness. Oral health and hygiene education sessions and demonstration and explanation of brushing techniques would go a long way in inculcating among children oral healthcare habits. These oral health education sessions will be supported with audio/video presentations. The entire emphasis thus is on securing optimal oral health of future generations. These dental examinations are expected to improve oral health conditions among primary school children belonging to the marginalized sections of the community who have little access to affordable oral healthcare.

Besides focusing on educating children on oral health and hygiene, a teacher training component had been included to impart the necessary knowledge about subjects that

facilitated oral health promotion. Teachers were given training in oral health and hygiene aimed at sustaining the programme.

Teachers were also trained by the dental team to involve children in giving expression to their own creative ideas of 'best smile' or 'healthy smile' through a drawing contest/art exhibition. This facilitated the dental team that conducted oral health education sessions to make use of these drawings to engage the children in an interactive educational process and participate in the oral health messages. The teacher-training component was expected to sustain the project in the long run.

At a pre-launch of the programme in a Commercial High School and Junior College in South Mumbai 185 underprivileged children had been covered. The participating dental professionals conducted oral health awareness sessions stressing on the maintenance of oral hygiene, including the importance of brushing twice daily and demonstrating the right brushing techniques. Later they interacted with the children by organizing a "best smile" drawing competition. The managing trustees and teachers were very appreciative of the FDI-Ivoclar-IDA programme, the first of its kind focusing on underprivileged children.

## Oral Cancer Foundation



Members would certainly agree with me that the greatest hurdle to achieving the goal of optimal oral health for all is the dreaded



oral cancer. According to World Health Organization report, India ranks first in the world in oral cancer. Mortality from the disease remains high and survival has not improved in the last 30 years. As custodian of oral health in the country, IDA had been very much concerned about addressing the disease and its major causative factor, i.e., tobacco habit, to improve the oral health environment.

Members might recall that the establishment of the Oral Cancer Foundation for early detection and treatment was aimed at creating an 'oral cancer free' nation. Facilities

are being created for early detection and treatment to aid prevention and reduce mortality, besides educating the masses of the risk factors.

## SPOT Centres



Members are aware that SPOT (Spot, Prevent Oral-cancer Trauma) Centre is a diagnostic tool for early detection of oral malignancy and potentially malignant lesions set up under the aegis of Oral Cancer Foundation (OCF). SPOT Centres constitute a significant tool at reducing the incidence of oral cancer through early detection and treatment. The SPOT Centres have the necessary facilities required for detection of oral cancer, besides trained dentists specialised in oral cancer examinations, and counselling patients about the risks to cancer of their tobacco and alcohol habit.

The SPOT Centres also facilitate research by providing patient data. IDA's network of specialized SPOT Centres for early detection and treatment is crucial not only for oral lesion screening opportunities but for delivery of oral cancer preventive advice as well. IDA is confident that its endeavour would certainly pave the way for better oral health and quality of life in the country.

Members would be happy to know that despite the difficulties encountered a small beginning has been made in setting up a few SPOT Centres. There are currently 86 such Centres in operation in 17 States and 3 Union Territories across the country. A formal, minimally expensive, one day training is imparted to all those dental/healthcare professionals desirous of starting a SPOT Centre to create a class of professionals providing effective oral cancer service and education. The training equips them with the technique of carrying out detection of oral cancer lesion and the subsequent biopsy to strengthen their oral cancer prevention and detection service.

To train the dental professionals in oral cancer diagnosis your Association jointly with Head and Neck Department, Tata Memorial Hospital, organized a two day hands on course on oral cancer screening techniques on 25 and 26 November 2015. About 15 dental practitioners participated. The topics covered included (a) Epidemiology & aetiology of malignant and pre-malignant lesions of oral cavity (b) Screening and early detection of oral cancer (c) Tobacco: Health effects and cessation (d) Examination of oral cavity and neck in a patient of oral cancer (e) Biopsy of oral lesions (f) an overview of oral lesions and their management, (g) Understanding histopathology reports (h) Understanding radiology of oral lesions (i) Prosthetic & rehabilitation of oral cancer patient.

IDA would welcome healthcare professionals to be a part of its noble initiative by registering themselves for the initial training in early detection and treatment and to get their clinics certified as SPOT Centres. The idea is to make detection of precancerous lesions and counselling for prevention accessible to a larger number of persons by establishing SPOT Centres across the country. IDA is keen on creation of

a band of trained dental healthcare providers to man clinics certified as SPOT Centres for early detection and treatment. The idea is to establish more and more SPOT Centres across the country to make detection of precancerous lesions and counselling for prevention accessible to a larger number of persons.

## Oral Cancer Registry

Members are aware that an Oral Cancer Registry to exclusively register the number of oral cancer cases in the country has been set up for compilation and assimilation of research data on oral cancer as well as to facilitate conduct of oral cancer research in the country. These together marked the beginning of a new era in safeguarding the oral health of people through early detection and treatment.

## Tobacco Intervention Initiative



The TII (Tobacco Intervention Initiative) Centres, considered as effective tools for oral healthcare management, are being set up in various states by



dentists trained in behavioural counselling, medication and nicotine replacement therapy. Members would be happy to know that so far nearly 1036 TII Centres have become functional in various states and union territories. The setting up of TII Training Centres by IDA by utilising the services



of trained personnel to impart training to dentists in their own respective states has paid rich dividends going by the growing number of TII Centres in the country.

During the year under review, 9 TII trainings were conducted for which 340 participants had registered and as many as 287 participants have been trained leaving 53 pending registrations. These are being speeded up. We are hopeful of reporting of establishment of more and more Centres shortly. Trainings were also conducted at Hyderabad, Patna and Thane which were attended by about 90 members.

Establishment of TII and SPOT Centres brings to the members the wonderful opportunity of providing enhanced services to your patients and, more importantly to contribute to the national cause besides expanding your community outreach. In fact, these Centres give you a platform to get specialized training in oral cancer detection and tobacco cessation from the best in the field. It thus paves the way for registering your clinic as SPOT and TII Centres for oral cancer detection, behavioural counselling and nicotine replacement therapy. The interest and enthusiasm displayed by members in being a participant in this national cause deserve appreciation.

Members might observe that the entire North Eastern States, which have high rates of tobacco use in all its forms, are yet to set up any Centres there. It would be in the fitness of things if members from these states in the region become enthusiastic partners and join their counterparts from other states in IDA's relentless drive to reduce the incidence of oral cancer and tobacco related diseases in the country.

Needless to say, establishment of SPOT and TII Centres offers members the opportunity of rendering enhanced services to their patients and help reduce the incidence of tobacco related diseases. The interest and enthusiasm displayed by members in being a participant in this national cause deserve appreciation.

## Surveillance of dental check-up camps at Kumbh Mela

Members would be happy to know that your association undertook surveillance of the dental check up camps set up at Nashik as a part of The Jana Swasthya Project being implemented at the Simhastha Kumbh Mela, at Nashik that concluded in September last year. The project is in collaboration with the Department of Public Health, Government of Maharashtra, UNICEF and Harvard



University. Your Association was one of the partners along with Colgate, Jana Care, MGV Dental College, Nashik and Life Supporters Institute of Health Sciences to provide oral healthcare services.

Simhastha Kumbh Mela provided one of the most appropriate settings for oral health screening and awareness promotion. As members are aware, oral healthcare is a matter of continuing neglect by most people owing primarily to lack of awareness about its links with general health. Rural India still has a much compromised access to oral care.

Of the 55 Health Units setup under the project, dental health check up was carried out in 20 units, surveillance of which was the responsibility of your association.



## Child Dental Centre

Members may recall that a global caries initiative had been launched by FDI along with IADR and IFDEA for reducing prevalence of dental caries. Consistent with this global perspective, and true to its commitment to the strategy of prevention, IDA had launched the Child Dental Centre for prevention of dental caries among children. The Child Dental Centre is an initiative in response to the need to eradicate dental caries with the singular aim of achieving effective, widespread impact and significantly improving dental health, specifically of children, in the country. Dental caries, members are aware, is a highly prevalent and rapidly emerging chronic disease among children. The Child Dental Centre is an initiative in response to the need to eradicate dental caries with the singular aim of achieving effective, widespread impact and significantly improving dental health, specifically of children, in the country.

The Child Dental Centre (CDC) is an innovative oral healthcare management initiative envisioned by your Association in response to the need to eradicate caries. It has the singular objective of significantly improving dental health of children in the country. They are specialised clinics to control, prevent and eradicate tooth decay among children. Trained dental professionals would be provided with a kit that includes a technical manual, patient education compact disc, poster, a certificate and a plaque. A network of certified clinics has been set up across the country and enquiries are still being received from members. At the time of going to the press, there are 83 CDCs in operation in 19 states and 2 Union territories in the country.

Designed to provide effective preventive dental care, generate awareness about the greater implications of neglected oral health, it creates a new paradigm for caries management and dental healthcare.

## Dental Practice Accreditation

Members would agree that healthcare providers need to establish, maintain and apply standards that ensure excellent service and a high quality of care. Continuous improvement of dental and dental-related education should reflect the



evolving technology. It's IDA's endeavour to represent and better serve its fellow dentists by certifying their clinics accredited if their clinics fulfil the norms and quality standards of oral healthcare. The broad objective is to improve the quality of service rendered besides standardisation of the practice of dentistry in the country.

IDA is keen to ensure that the quality of service and the standards governing the service are at par with global standards. Accreditation is the acknowledgment of the standard of functioning of a dental clinic on the basis of independent assessment by an external organization. Dental practice accreditation provides the benchmark for excellence and the means to standardize and improve the practice of dentistry to facilitate rendering high quality of care. Hopefully, with dental practice accreditation, IDA should be able to provide a standardised dental healthcare system ensuring delivery of superior, current and internationally accepted treatment modalities while at the same time safeguarding the rights of both patients and dentists. You will be happy to know that your association is moving towards launching this new initiative on Dental Practice Accreditation shortly.

## Members' Profile



Members are aware that your Association has instituted an award for achievements in dental excellence. It's an award conferred on a member in recognition of his services to the community, in particular, and the profession, in general. To meet and know each other and recognize the potential of others, their achievements and personal status a web platform for members has been developed. Christened as 'Profile of the Month' the winner is selected purely on an objective assessment of the comprehensive information submitted by the member via the curriculum vitae uploaded every month during a specific period. Selection of the CVs for online voting by members is based on academic excellence and the nature of services rendered. The member who gets the maximum number of votes is declared winner and given the 'Profile of the Month' award. Winners of the monthly award qualify for the 'Profile of the year' award from amongst whom the member who secures maximum votes is confirmed the 'Profile of the Year' winner. I am happy to say that the response has been quite encouraging.

The winning 'Profile of the Year' 2014-15 was Dr. Shailee Fotedar, an assistant professor in the Department of Public Health Dentistry, Himachal Pradesh Government Dental College and Hospital, Shimla and a fellow of the Pierre Fauchard Academy.

## Professional Indemnity Insurance Cover

Members would be happy to know that IDA has recently conceived of a scheme to provide comprehensive insurance benefits covering liabilities falling on the dental professionals whilst rendering professional service. The scheme has been promoted in association with National Insurance Company Limited, a government of India undertaking, and Secure Insurance Services. Known as the Professional Indemnity Insurance Scheme, it provides insurance cover against legal

liability to pay damages arising out of negligence in the performance of their professional duties. It is an exclusive insurance cover that provides for IDA members a wide range of insurance benefits against legal liability arising from errors and omissions while rendering professional services. By offering this indemnity insurance cover, IDA wants to ensure that its members received professional indemnity.

The response from members has been very encouraging.

## Patient Education Brochures

Driven by the desire to attain its goal of optimal oral health in the country, IDA has been bringing out quite a few oral healthcare brochures with a view to educating the patients. These brochures highlight, in simple language, the various oral health diseases, their causes, symptoms, the risk factors, the need for care, the various treatment procedures, preventive mechanisms and oral hygiene principles to be adopted. They contain information presented in a lucid manner which helps improve patient comprehension, enable them make informed decisions about their own dental healthcare and facilitate oral health promotion by improving communication between dental healthcare service providers and the patients. They provide the complete solution for patient education at the point of care.

The object is to eventually bring about behavioural changes in them to facilitate pursuance of better oral health and hygiene intended at preventing oral diseases. This is consistent with IDA's strategy of pioneering prevention by creating awareness about oral diseases and advocating measures to prevent them through maintenance of oral hygiene. Improvement in the quality of oral care delivered has also been a matter that has been engaging our attention.

Minimally priced, the brochures can be utilised by the patients, dental clinics, hospitals, community health centres, polyclinics, and health insurance management. These oral health brochures can be effectively utilized not only by the patients, but by students, academicians and even those dentally discerned.

There are 32 oral health patient education brochures on various oral healthcare topics together with instruction cards each priced at a concessionary rate of Rs. 3 to members. Additionally, a set of 4 posters, personalised products of various types and acrylic stands for display of posters at the clinic are also available.

I am very happy to inform you that the response to these brochures has been extremely overwhelming and, in the wake of growing interest for them, effective measures are being taken to comply with increasing demands. Members would agree that the patient education brochures would go a long way in enhancing the clinical practice of members as also developing communication channels and longstanding bond of trust between the patients and the dental healthcare service providers.



# Continuing Education Programme

Expand the horizon of knowledge and the skill gets enhanced to use the knowledge better.



With rapidly changing technology and the consequent improvements in technical procedures attendant on it, we need to keep the dental professionals abreast of the ongoing changes in dental science. Skills need to be directly proportional to the expanding knowledge and appropriately improved consistent with the emerging technology and requirement. Continuing education provides updates on new knowledge; new knowledge in specific areas; introduction to, or opportunities for, mastery of new skills and techniques; solutions to problems in dental care and alterations in delivery of healthcare to enhance dental care to the community. The essence of continuing education is that dental practice should undergo frequent review in order to most appropriately address community needs.

To meet this ever growing need of dental professionals, IDA has taken upon itself the conduct of CDE programmes with a view to making members enhance their professional image through accreditation. Towards this end, IDA has been assembling some of the best minds, latest advancements and most innovative techniques in the business for the purpose of continuing education in the dental industry. These programmes enhanced the professional competence of clinicians to provide better quality of care to the community, besides promoting their own professional advancement.

## Accredited Continuing Dental Education Programmes

Dental education in order to most appropriately address community needs calls for regular review in the wake of globalisation of dentistry. Every practising and teaching dental professional needs to understand the technological changes happening around them to widen their knowledge and update their clinical skills. In order to help members improve their professional competence, IDA has been planning, conceiving, organizing as well as conducting Accredited Continuing Dental Education Programmes (ACDEP). Besides earning academic credit points, which are significant value-additions to their basic qualification, these programmes help professional advancement of members as well. 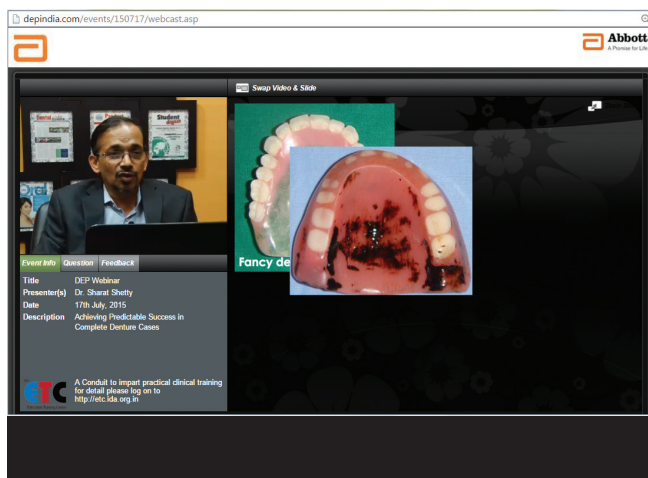
## Sponsored CDE series

## IDA-FDI CDE Programme

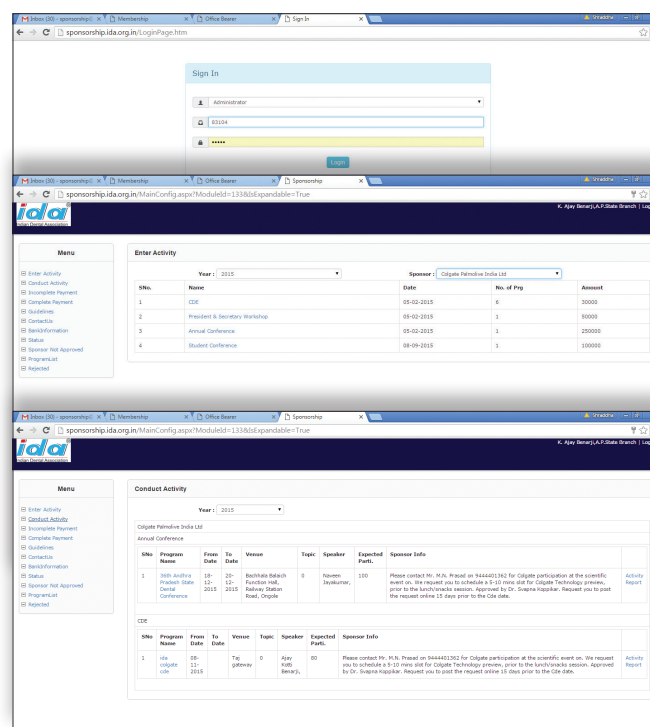
It may be recalled that the FDI-IDA CDE programme, which IDA had been organizing as an annual feature, was designed at promoting professional advancement of its members for knowledge enhancement and upgrading skills so that it enables them to render quality service to the community.

The prestigious FDI-IDA CDE Programme, which is a significant value-addition, assumed greater importance. During the year under reference, the Madras Branch of IDA hosted the 2-day knowledge enriching programme from



30 – 31 October, 2015 at SRM Dental College, Ramapuram, Chennai. Renowned dental professionals entertained the 450 delegates from all across the country assembled at the combined conference. Prof.JM ('Bob') ten Cate from Netherlands was the chief guest who addressed the gathering on the subject of cariology titled 'New opportunities for caries control- Counteracting the acid challenge'. He shared valuable information on research done in the use of fluorides and other advanced molecules to combat caries.

## Online Sponsorship Activity



To control, administer and moderate the various activities being undertaken by branches and sponsored by different agencies, IDA has developed a user friendly online application, which can be easily operated by the branch secretary. By logging onto this link, the branch secretary will be able to access information on the different sponsors, the programmes sponsored by each sponsor, sponsorship amount based on the branch strength, etc. Branch Secretaries

would be required to submit reports and photographs online to initiate the payment process. More and more branches are obtaining PAN Cards and submitting bank details online to facilitate the agencies sponsoring programmes by direct credit to the bank accounts of respective branches.

## Clinical Research Programme



Members would be happy to know that a one year part-time Post-Graduate Diploma Certificate Course in Clinical Research has been started by your Association from April 2015. The programme, conducted on all Saturday afternoons, offers classroom lectures as well as online distance education. Candidates holding a basic B.D.S degree and postgraduates in dentistry are eligible to avail of the course, the response for which has been very encouraging, indeed.

Encouraged by the enthusiastic response to the programme, a second batch was begun from November. The sessions are being held on all Sundays.

You all would agree that interest in clinical research in the country has increased considerably over the past decade. Several factors have contributed to this growing interest, particularly educated manpower and employment opportunities. There are significant employment potentials for clinical researchers inasmuch as Indian companies are expected to be engaged in conducting more than 15 per cent of global research trials. Members will be happy to know that we will be launching the Post Graduate Diploma course in Forensic Odontology in June 2016 and the National Dental Accreditation Programme is expected to commence shortly.

## Educational Training Centres

The Educational Training Centres (ETCs) are another channel for the conduct of CDE besides clinical training. The programmes usually covered are the refresher courses for professional advancement. However, these courses conducted by different agencies differed in consistency



and uniformity. Recognising the need to introduce uniform standards, IDA set up the ETCs for the purpose of conducting various courses at subsidized rates for the benefit of IDA members. The programmes involve lectures, practical demonstrations, hands-on courses and group discussions. The ETCs facilitate conduct of continuing programmes with emphasis on teaching clinical techniques and skills necessary to enable members to remain proficient in their own chosen fields of clinical practice.

Members would be happy to know that thirty two hands-on courses were conducted during the year under reference benefiting 550 participants. A free implant surgery that benefitted thirty five needy people from the marginalised sections of the community was also organized as a part of IDA's social responsibility.

The ETCs enable the dental professionals to avail of the benefit of various education modules offered round the year at affordable fees. The benefits to the members accrue in the form of credit points, as each programme has been assigned a certain number of credit hours which add significant value to their qualifications. Even those practising in the rural and remote areas of the country are able to avail of these programmes.

## Emergency Dental Centres

Emergency Dental Care (EDC) is a novel concept at offering steady, reliable and uninterrupted dental service throughout the week. Members are aware that IDA had launched a venture of utmost importance to provide reliable dental care to the people as and when they need – 24 hours on all days of the week. EDC is driven by the consistent public demand for emergency dental services. Members would certainly agree that such a service undoubtedly goes a long way in providing successful dental practice every dentist yearns for and in improving dental care and the oral health scenario in the country. With right ambience, tools and equipment, coupled with dedicated and responsive staff, EDCs would facilitate in offering high quality service to the patients and a successful dental practice that every dentist longs for.

Members would be happy to know that there are at present as many as 286 Emergency Dental Centres in operation in various states across the country. Maharashtra (89), Gujarat (24) Rajasthan (23) Tamil Nadu (22) and Karnataka (20) lead the states in setting up EDCs. Members from the North Eastern States, barring Assam, are conspicuous by their absence. Going by the good number of enquiries being received by your Association the potential for expansion is good. Dental professionals who participate in this innovative social scheme will be given a monogram which they can stick at their clinic as a mark of certification by IDA. EDCs are listed in the area-wise search list wherein patients in need of such care can easily locate them in their nearest areas for any emergency dental care.

## World No Tobacco Day

Members are aware that your Association celebrates the 'World No Tobacco Day' on 31 May every year to educate the community on the dangers of using tobacco and its products. This year the Day was celebrated with an oral cancer detection camp with tobacco de-addiction advice and a panel discussion on the fatal effects of tobacco use. Both these were organized with the help of the TOI media ET Now.

A free Oral Cancer Detection Camp with Tobacco De-addiction Advice was organized at the Siddhivinayak Temple, at Prabhadevi near Dadar, a Mumbai suburb, in association with Shree Siddhivinayak Temple Trust. At the daylong camp dental checkups and oral screenings were conducted to detect any early signs of oral cancer amongst the devotees who visited the temple besides rendering Tobacco De-addiction Advice through various audio visual aids. You may be happy to know that nearly 700 availed of the dental check

up and oral screening. Two suspected cases were referred to the TATA Memorial Hospital. Awareness lectures delivered at the venue highlighted the various negative effects of tobacco usage. A panel discussion titled **"Say YES to Life and NO to Tobacco"** to highlight the harmful effects of tobacco use was organized in association with the ET NOW channel. The distinguished panel members included Dr Pankaj Chaturvedi, the renowned head and neck surgeon of Tata Memorial Hospital, Mumbai, Dr Monika Arora, Director of Health Promotion and Tobacco Control Division of Public Health Foundation of India, Dr M Basade, Professor, Medical Oncology, Jaslok Hospital, Mumbai, Dr Alias Thomas and Dr Ashok Dhoble, President and Hon. Secretary General respectively of IDA. The moderator for the discussion was Ms Manvi Dhillon Sinha of ET NOW.

The panel members were unanimous on the need for coordinated action by all the stakeholders concerned and to initiate appropriate policies by the government to prevent tobacco use and safeguard the health of the community. The discussion was effectively moderated by Ms Manvi Dhillon Sinha. The programme was telecast on 30 and 31 May, on ET NOW.



## World Oral Health Day



Members would remember that the World Oral Health Day is celebrated on 20 March every year. It's a Day to celebrate the benefits of a healthy mouth and the importance of maintaining oral hygiene to promote worldwide awareness of the issues around oral health. To mark the occasion, your Association organized a dental check up camp of the elderly persons at the Nanavati Super Speciality Hospital, at Vile Parle in Mumbai. Besides, they were advised on oral health and hygiene and the preventive measures that would enable them to sustain their natural dentition and 'Smile for Life'. The free check-up was held under the leadership of Dr. S S Khambay and Dr. Meena Khambay, Maxillofacial Surgeons from Nanavati Super Speciality Hospital.

Stressing on the general apathy towards oral health by the authorities, senior citizens and some leading practitioners called for bringing dental diseases also under the purview of health insurance.

A session, post the talks, helped participants to better understand the importance of oral health and making it also very interactive.

The event marked Nanavati Super Speciality Hospital's collaboration with India Dental Association to play a major role in achieving IDA's Vision: "Optimal National Oral Health for all by 2020".

Elsewhere a dental check up camp for bus drivers and office staff of Navi Mumbai Municipal Transport (NMMT) was organized from 18 to 20 March at Turbhe and Kalamboli Bus Depots in Navi Mumbai. A good number of employees totalling 415 participated in the three day dental check

up camp held from 10 am to 6 pm. Some of them had exhibited the beginnings of leukoplakia on account of consistent chewing of tobacco. The participating employees were advised appropriate dental treatment and those exhibiting cancerous lesions were advised to contact their family physicians for further course of action. The doctors conducting the camp also delivered a talk on oral health and hygiene and the links oral health have with general health besides highlighting the ill effects of tobacco. It was a good occasion to reach out to a greater audience of underprivileged blue collared sections of society and spread the message of "Smile for Life" to create better awareness of oral health and its importance. This activity was supported by Colgate.

To sustain the message, trained dental surgeons from IDA also conducted special Teachers' Training and Parent's Orientation Programmes. Through partnerships with governments, dental professionals, schools and community groups, BSBF programme increases oral health literacy and promotes good oral care habits. ## IDA-Colgate Online CDE Programme



Members are aware that IDA has developed a user friendly online mechanism, which can be easily operated by the branch secretary. This enables the branch to control, administer and moderate the various activities being undertaken by branches and sponsored by different agencies.

By logging onto this link, the branch secretary will be able to access information on the different sponsors, the programmes sponsored by each sponsor, sponsorship amount based on the branch strength, etc. Branch Secretaries would be required to submit reports and photographs of the activity conducted to the sponsors online to initiate the payment process.

During the year under review 17 state (61 CDEs) and 152 local branches (508 CDEs) together conducted 569 Online CDE programmes (545 last year). The branches conducting maximum (seven) CDE programmes numbered 42 which entitles these branches to conduct one more CDE. This spirit was not seen in the case of 226 branches (185 last year) which failed to conduct any programme during the current year.

Although branches have been advised to obtain PAN card and submit all bank details online to facilitate payment by direct credit to the bank accounts of respective branches, only 130 branches have so far complied. There are quite a few branches (265) that have still not complied with PAN card requirements. We would urge branches which are yet to fulfil these formalities, to do so at the earliest to be able to organize and conduct CDE programmes and avail of the accreditation benefits

# Reports on CDE, CDH, JIDA



## CDE Reports

I am pleased to present the report on Continuing Dental Education activities during the year under review.

According to CDE Regulations approved by the Dental Council of India and the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India, all registered dental surgeons are to obtain 100 credit points over a period of five years calculated at 20 credit points of CDE per year. It will be essential to achieve a minimum of 15 and a maximum of 25 points a year. At the same time, 10 points for asepsis and infection control and 5 points for dental jurisprudence over a period of 5 years are mandatory.

In keeping with these regulations, and to assist our members, IDA has been organizing CDE programmes for their benefit. The CDE Programmes reflected IDA's commitment to professional advancement of its members and delivery of quality service to the community.

I am very happy to present to you our report on CDE activities conducted during the year.

The annual FDI-IDA CDE programme as you all know aimed at promoting professional advancement of members through knowledge enhancement and skill up-gradation besides contributing to significant value-addition by way of academic accreditation. During the year under review, the programme was hosted by the Madras State Branch in October, 2015 at SRM Dental College, Ramapuram, Chennai. Distinguished dental professionals shared their knowledge and experience with the participants. Prof. JM ('Bob') ten Cate from Netherlands was the chief guest who addressed the gathering on the subject of cariology titled 'New opportunities for caries control- Counteracting the acid challenge'. He shared valuable information on research done in the use of fluorides and other advanced molecules to combat caries.

Under the IDA-Colgate sponsored CDE Programmes, 169 branches – 17 State and 152 Local – conducted 569 Online CDE programmes ranging from one to a maximum of seven. In all 42 branches conducted the maximum number of seven CDE programmes. There were 226 branches which did not conduct any CDE programme.

I take this opportunity to gratefully acknowledge the cooperation and support received from all concerned at IDA HO, State and Local Branches for the successful conduct of the CDE programmes.

We are pleased to present to you the report on the IDA-CDH activities carried out during the year. As usual, the popular programmes continued to be the IDA-Colgate "Bright Smiles Bright Futures" Programme, the Teacher Training Programme, etc., aimed at promoting awareness of oral health and hygiene through education and preventive measures. During the year, the IDA-Colgate 'Bright Smiles Bright Futures Programme' was implemented by 108 branches from 21 states. 2. In my opinion, proper books of account as required by law have been kept by the Association, in so far as it appears from my examination of the books;


3. The Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts;

Similarly, The Service Tax Liability on FDI 2014 has been discharged during the year.
3. Fixed Assets are depreciated on written down basis at the rates prescribed as per Income Tax Act, 1961.
4. Details of Life Members admitted during the year are pending for reconciliation with the amount of Life Membership fees received. Hence, we are unable to comment on the correctness of Life Membership Fees shown under the head "Subscription" in the Income and Expenditure Account of Life Members Account.
5. The Outstanding Balance in respect of Closing Loans and Advances, Deposit, Investment, is subject to confirmation, reconciliation and adjustment, if any.
6. All the expenses are authorized and approved by the Trustees / Committees.
7. Figures are rounded off to the nearest Rupee.
8. Previous year's figures are regrouped and / or reclassified, wherever necessary, to make them comparable.




